Terms of Reference (TOR)

Consultant – Value Chain Development (Consultancy Basis)

1. Background

The Smallholder Agribusiness and Resilience Project (SARP), jointly financed by the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) and the Government of Sri Lanka, aims to build the resilience and market participation of 40,000 rural households in the climate change-affected districts of Anuradhapura, Vavuniya, Matale, Mannar, Puttalam, and Kurunegala. This objective is achieved through capacity building for climate resilience and inclusive value chains, together with investments in climate-resilient infrastructure, including last-mile infrastructure.

The Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Land & Irrigation is the Lead Programme Agency and has established a dedicated Project Management Unit (PMU) at the central level and two Regional Hub Offices for the implementation of SARP.

2. Scope of Work

The Consultant – Value Chain Development will provide strategic leadership and technical oversight for the planning, implementation, coordination, and monitoring of all value chain interventions under the project. The role is responsible for enhancing the competitiveness, productivity, market access, and sustainability of selected agricultural value chains. This will be achieved through effective engagement with public and private sector stakeholders, producer organizations, financial institutions, and service providers.

3. Objective of the Assignment

Coordinate with 4P, Resilience and Youth Development Programme and to deliver technical expertise in the design and implementation of inclusive, market-oriented value chain development strategies. The primary goal is to drive increased productivity, value addition, market integration, private sector investment, and income growth for smallholder farmers and agribusiness enterprises.
